## Witnessing Window

Want an easy, non-threatening way to engage a Mormon in a worthwhile conversation? Use **WDJD4U**. It's on my license plate! What is **WDJD4U**? Well, you are probably familiar with WWJD – What Would Jesus Do? WWJD is on Bumper stickers, rings, and pins. It reminds Christians that before they react to a situation they should consider how Jesus might react. Since Christians have been brought to life by Christ and given the gift of eternal life, Christ lives in them. WWJD reminds them to let Christ's light shine! For Christians WWJD is a way to exercise their faith, to show God how thankful they are for Jesus' substitutionary life and death. Because they have been freed from the law, they are free to do what Jesus would do out of love for their Savior.

The LDS Church has enthusiastically adopted the slogan of WWJD. It is sold in LDS bookstores in many forms. But, in the hands of a religion which believes it must perform works to earn eternal life it is no longer a God pleasing tool. Instead it becomes an instrument of death. To Mormons WWJD reinforces the doctrine that Jesus only opened the door. That it is their responsibility to pay Jesus back. That they must do all they can do their entire life on earth and then for eons in the spirit world. That they must earn their way to live with God predicated on their obedience to the laws and ordinances of the LDS church. Instead of an expression of freedom, WWJD becomes an expression of slavery. Because their eternal life is dependant on their obedience, they are required to do what Jesus would do out of need – to gain their eternal life.

So what's **WDJD4U**? To Christians it's what *precedes* WWJD. It's what *supercedes* WWJD. It's the message that saves a soul for all eternity! It's the basis of our Christian faith. It's **"What Did Jesus Do For You?"**

Christians answer this question *"Everything!"* *"He paid the price of my sins, and I have been set free! He lived a perfect life and gives me his robe of righteousness! I am credited with his perfection! I receive all of this through my faith that he did everything!"* This answer is the message that brings eternal life to the spiritually dead. It is the good news that Jesus came to earth to bring and to fulfill.



Mormons answer this question with an answer that brings eternal death. *“Jesus opened the door, set the stage. He did his part and now my eternal life depends on what I do. If I don’t do all I can do, I will not receive eternal life. On Judgment Day I will stand for good or ill on the basis of my own works.”* Since Jesus commanded *“Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect.”* **Matthew 5:48 (KJV)**, even “all you can do” falls far short. All who stand on Judgment Day on their own works will receive a death sentence.

So you want an easy to remember, non-threatening way to engage a Mormon in a worthwhile conversation? Talk to her or him about what Jesus did for you. Ask them **“What Did Jesus Do For You?”**

The answer you get may *sound* Christian. You may need to ask clarifying questions to get at the heart of the matter: That Christ did not win their eternal life; he only created the opportunity for them to do it themselves. Once this is clear, talk about the benefits you receive from what Jesus did for you. Compare these with the benefits she or he receives. Through asking one simple question, **WDJD4U**, the Holy Ghost can work through you to bring a lost soul to faith. Once this happens, this new child of God can look on WWJD with a new light, the light of the sure knowledge that he or she is now a resident of heaven. In this light WWJD is no longer an obligation, an expression of their slavery, but the free expression of Love for one’s all-powerful Savior!
